CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Killingsworth welcomed everyone and called the Technical Advisory Committee meeting to order at 10 a.m. Introductions were made around the room.

PUBLIC COMMENT

► A. APPROVE THE AUGUST 2, 2023 MEETING MINUTES

Chairman Killingsworth asked that the August Technical Advisory Committee meeting minutes be approved.

Lynn Rutkowski moved to approve the August 2, 2023 meeting minutes; Robert Companion seconded; motion unanimously carried.

►B. AMENDMENT OF THE TAC BYLAWS

Jeff Sheffield informed the group the St. Johns River Water Management District has requested to be a member of the TPO Board. Based on our Board structure, we recommend they be added to the TAC.

Mr. Sheffield asked for questions.

Mr. Sheffield responded this amendment would only add one seat to the TAC.

Chris LeDew asked if project #433112-5 – SR 139 (US 23) Kings Rd. at Union St., Brady St., and Whitner St. Pedestrian Safety Improvement is the Hawk signal at the "S" line bike trail.

Ms. Kutney responded this project is to install a mid-block crossing upgrade in the existing crosswalks.

Dodie Selig moved to approve the FDOT's request to amend the FY 2023/24 through FY 2027/28 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP); Justin Ryan seconded; motion unanimously carried.

▶ D. DRAFT BOUNDARY AND APPORTIONMENT PLAN

Clark Letter presented the draft Boundary and Apportionment Plan, with no proposed changes.

After each decennial census, MPOs must review their membership composition and metropolitan planning area (MPA) boundaries and submit an Apportionment Plan that meets the requirements of FS s.339.175(3), FS s.339.175 (4), and 23 CFR 450.310. Apportionment Plans must include the following:

- 2010 and 2020 Census population in the MPO area
- Current MPO membership (local governments and agencies)
- Proposed MPO membership (local governments and agencies)
- The methodology used to determine the proposed changes if there are any proposed changes.
- MPA boundary map
- MPO Board resolution adopting the Apportionment Plan

Mr. Letter asked for questions. There were no questions at this time.

Justin Ryan moved to approve the Boundary and Apportionment Plan; Mark McManus seconded; motion unanimously carried.

E. BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN MASTER PLAN UPDATE

Rebecca Dennis of Atkins presented the Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan Update.

Ms. Dennis asked for questions. There were no questions at this time.

F. SMART NORTH FLORIDA UPDATE

Clayton Levins gave the following update.

- Gateway to Clay Smart Corridor The problem statement was to use data driven studies to present practical solutions to traffic conditions along the Wells Road corridor. StreetScope and Street Simplified were the two technologies that were used for this corridor project.
- StreetScope Uses a proprietary algorithm to assess traffic risk on the roadway by analyzing dash cam footage. Six different drivers were used to record data at the AM peak, afternoon and PM peak periods over three days. Several "hot spots" were identified.
- Street Simplified Uses a proprietary algorithm to assess traffic risk at intersections. Cameras are mounted to traffic poles at four-way intersections

recording data for a 24-hour period. The footage is analyzed and feedback is provided in under a month's time.

Staff is soliciting projects for the annual List of Priority Projects (LOPP). This is a candidate list of projects for the new fifth year of the Florida Department of Transportation's Five Year Work Program. Please submit your initial priority projects no later than **January 26, 2024**. We understand that formal approval by your county commission or council may take longer, but this request will enable TPO staff to prepare a first draft of the LOPP for the February round of committee and Board meetings. Our expectation will be to adopt the LOPP in March.

The LOPP document includes the following categories of projects:

• Region-Wide Priority Projects – Transportation Capacity Projects

This list is perhaps the most important. This list of 20 projects represents the larger capacity and high priority projects throughout the TPO area. This list does not change substantially from year to year, as projects are typically only removed from the list when construction funding has been programmed.

Aviation Priority Projects

Jacksonville Aviation Authority and St. Augustine - St. Johns County Airport Authority can each submit a list of its priorities for inclusion in the document. The TPO includes these as a reference, but does not re-prioritize these projects.

Mass Transit Priorities

Jacksonville Transportation Authority and St. Johns/Sunshine Bus can each submit a list of its priorities for inclusion in the document. The TPO includes these as a reference, but does not re-prioritize these projects.

Port Priority Projects

JAXPORT and the Ocean Highway & Port Authority of Nassau County can each submit a list of its priorities for inclusion in the document. The TPO includes these as a reference, but does not re-prioritize these projects.

• Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) – Multi-Use Trails

TAP projects are funded on a rotational basis by County. Applications must be submitted through the GAP system.

• Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) – School Safety Sidewalks

This program mirrors the Safe Routes to Schools criteria. TAP projects are funded on a rotational basis by County. Applications must be submitted through the GAP system.

• SUN Trail Program – Multi-Use Trails

It is especially critical that each county submit one viable project for each of the TAP and SUN Trail Programs. <u>Cost estimates must be provided</u>. It is recommended you revisit the project submitted annually to ensure it is still feasible. Applications must be submitted through the GAP system.

• Transportation Regional Incentive Program Priorities

Transportation Regional Incentives Program (TRIP) priorities reflect the region-wide priority list.

Again, please submit your initial priority projects no later than January 26, 2024.
