►B. AMENDMENT OF THE UNIFIED PLANNING WORK PROGRAM (UPWP) FOR FY 2020/21 THROUGH FY 2021/22 (ENCUMBERING FY 2019/20 SU/CM FUNDS)

Angela Session presented the amendment of the Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) for FY 2020/21 through FY 2021/22.

At the end of the prior year's UPWP (FY 2018/19 through FY 2019/20), there was a contract balance in the amounts of \$142,625 (SU funds) and \$31,135 (CMAQ funds). Ms. Bunnewith asked for questions. There were no questions at this time.

Ari Jolly moved to approve the Joint Certification of the Metropolitan Planning Process; Daniel Bean seconded; motion unanimously carried.

F. 2021 LIST OF PRIORITY PROJECTS (LOPP)

Denise Bunnewith presented the 2021 List of Priority Projects (LOPP). A draft was presented at the February meeting.

Ms. Bunnewith asked for questions.

 Randy DeFoor commented that she was contacted by the media regarding the Collins Road project on this list. Collins Road is the number one crash site in Jacksonville. Ms. DeFoor wanted to know why that factor would not give this project a higher status on the list.

Ms. Bunnewith responded that it is not important where it is on the list, but that it is on the list itself.

 Randy DeFoor commented that it appears that the Collins Road project does not have any funding.

Mr. Sheffield responded that it will not have any funding associated with it. This is our list of priority projects that we are seeking funding for. Historically, this list was comprised of 50 to 60 projects. We have worked with FDOT and decided that 20 projects will give us a better opportunity to provide funding while working toward achieving our regional priorities.

 Randy DeFoor commented that the media did not know who the TPO is and what you do. Ms. DeFoor thinks this is an excellent opportunity to inform the public about the TPO.

Mr. Sheffield responded that historically it has been a challenge to inform the public of who we are and what we do.

• Chairman Newby commented that the TPO does a lot of great work and this is an excellent opportunity to let the public know.

Daniel Bean moved to approve the 2021 List of Priority Projects (LOPP); Randy DeFoor seconded; motion unanimously carried.

G. JTA INITIATIVES PRESENTATION

Nathaniel Ford, JTA's CEO, gave an update on their ongoing and upcoming initiatives.

Mr. Ford asked for questions.

 Mayor Brown wanted to know if there are any discussions to bring Amtrak back downtown.

Mr. Ford responded that discussions are ongoing. JTA, along with COJ, is in discussions to expand the Local Option Gas Tax (LOGT). One of JTA's projects on our list is a full development and examination of a Skyway station in the LaVilla area as well as commuter rail options.

Mayor Brown commented that would be great economically for Jacksonville.

- Randy DeFoor commented that Mr. Ford is doing a great job in his efforts to improve transportation in Jacksonville.
- Christian Whitehurst wanted to know if JTA anticipates an increase in ridership on the connector from St. Johns County to downtown. Mr. Whitehurst would also like to know what the JTA plans to do to increase ridership.

Mr. Ford responded that this service was launched during the pandemic, and we are currently working on a strategy to encourage ridership.

H. ANNUAL ASSESSMENTS FOR 2021

Denise Bunnewith presented the annual assessments for 2021.

Ms. Bunnewith asked for questions. There were no questions at this time.

I. DRAFT REQUESTED STUDIES FOR FY 2021/22 UNIFIED PLANNING WORK PROGRAM (UPWP)

Denise Bunnewith presented the draft list of requested studies for the FY 2021/22 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP).

Ms. Bunnewith asked for questions.

- Wayne Bolla wanted to know when will this list be finalized.
 - Mr. Sheffield responded that we will condense the list to what we can afford, and action will be brought before the Board in May.
- James Bennett asked that JAXPORT be included in the M-95 Marine Highway Study findings.

J. SMART NORTH FLORIDA UPDATE

Mr. Sheffield gave the following update.

- SNF has hired an Executive Director. The Board's intent was to provide a two-year contract for this individual to build the resources and partnerships to maintain SNF.
- March is the new award date for the National Science Foundation broadband grant.
- The Department of Economic Opportunity's Florida Broadband Office has a grant opportunity. Duval County Schools is mirroring that application to help supplement broadband in the east side of Jacksonville.
- A continued goal of SNF is to make St. Augustine the nation's first smart city. In partnership with FDOT, we have secured \$1 million in a state grant to continue to work on the smart city elements. The state DOT has elected to apply for a federal build grant using this project as one of the three projects for submittal.
- Mr. Sheffield spoke with NASA regarding an electronic transfer exchange.
 The goal is to connect with universities to let the students "play" with the technology to learn and create opportunities.

K. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

- TPO staff has been facilitating conversations with the Northeast Florida Regional Council to transition the responsibility of the TD Coordinating Board, as they already have this responsibility for six of the surrounding counties. The TD Board supports this idea. Staff has communicated this with the TD State Commission, and it will be brought before their board for a vote later this month. The goal is to have this transfer complete by July 1.
- The General Planning Consultant RFP has been advertised, with the RFP for our Marketing Consultant to follow shortly. The goal is to have these two items before you in June for approval, with the contracts executed no later than June 30.
- The MPOAC will hold a workshop via Zoom on March 19-20 and April 23-24.
- Randy DeFoor wanted to know if we cannot attend, can we get the materials.

Mr. Sheffield responded that we can provide the materials. Staff is working on providing an alternate option of a half day in-person training session.

L. <u>SECRETARY OF TRANSPORTATION'S REPORT</u>

Larry Parks informed the Board that FDOT has projects that are ready to go if a federal stimulus becomes available.

M. AUTHORITY REPORTS

Ray Alfred – Jacksonville Aviation Authority – March 25 beginning at 3:30 p.m. JAA is launching a new flight from Jacksonville to Los Angeles. Please let Mr. Alfred know if you would like to attend. Interviews are ongoing for an Engineer for the Cecil Field location. TSA is proposing a fine of \$250-\$1500 for passengers refusing to wear a mask.

James Bennett (for Daniel Bean) – JAXPORT – Our container volumes continue to increase. The harboring deepening project is three years ahead of schedule with completion anticipated in 2022. Berth improvements are ongoing. Blount Island improvements will begin shortly. March 24 JAXPORT will host a virtual Small Business Appreciation Day that will provide training and resources for small businesses.

 Randy DeFoor wanted to know what factors contributed to the increase in container volumes.

Mr. Bennett responded that we saw a decrease in volumes due to the pandemic. As the economy is making a comeback, we have had a tremendous resurgence in demand for goods and services and automobiles.

Mike Cole – Nassau County Ocean Highway and Port Authority – Tonnage is up. We have recently hired an Administrative Office Manager and a Port Attorney. Mr. Cole will represent the Port on the Florida Ports Council.

Ari Jolly – Jacksonville Transportation Authority – The JTA has been taking steps to make sure that vaccination sites are accessible to those eligible to receive the vaccine through the Ride to Health initiative. In partnership with COJ, the Florida Department of Health for Duval County, and other health service organizations, JTA has been providing safe, clean, and reliable transportation to available COVID-19 vaccination distribution locations. Several bus routes have been adjusted to make detours to vaccine locations. Customers also have the option of using our ReadiRide service, which operates in zones throughout the city, many of which have been expanded to provide additional support to the community during COVID-19 vaccine distribution. The JTA also offers free rides on both JTA buses and ReadiRide to the population deemed by the state eligible to be vaccinated.

JTA welcomed its latest autonomous vehicle, the EV Star. This is the first ADA-compliant, zero-emission paratransit vehicle to come to the JTA's Automation and Innovation Division. The EV Star is part of our AV Test & Learn Program at the Armsdale Park-n-Ride and Test & Learn facility.

The JTA awarded a \$1.21 million contract to Superior Construction Co., Inc. to build a new Skyway station in Brooklyn. This will be the first new Skyway station in over two decades. The JTA will convert our existing staging track at the Skyway Operations and Maintenance facility at 725 Leila Street with parking and ADA access. The Brooklyn Station will connect to the Central Skyway Station at West Bay and Lee Streets. The station will expand transportation options for those living and working in downtown, Brooklyn, and San Marco and is scheduled to be open by September 2021.

In 2020, JTA and COJ launched a one-year pilot program called Door-to-Store to provide free rides to grocery stores in Northwest Jacksonville to combat food desserts. The Jacksonville City Council is reviewing legislation to continue the pilot for an additional year and to expand the program's boundaries to include the New Town neighborhood. Door-to-Store has helped hundreds of families get to seven local grocery stores, eliminating a barrier and improving the quality of life for those communities. The expanded service territory will take effect once the City Council approves legislation. JTA provides this service through ReadiRide.

Re: CTC Memorandum of Agreement

Dear Mr. Sheffield:

The JTA has received your letter dated March 5, 2021 regarding the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between the JTA and the Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged (TD) to continue to operate as the Duval County's Community Transportation Coordinator (CTC). At this time, JTA wishes to express its interest in continuing as the CTC for Duval County.

JTA has developed and implemented new programs enhancing accessible public transportation for the transportation disadvantaged during the past twenty years as the Duval County CTC. Below are some recent accomplishments achieved during JTA's service as the CTC:

- Increased the household income requirement from 125% to 150% to ensure underserved TD individuals are able to utilize transportation services.
- Updated the Transportation Disadvantaged Life sustaining (TDLS) policy to ensure individuals utilizing this transportation model are converted to full TD or ADA sponsorship within six months.
- Created a Transportation Disadvantaged Veteran Services (TDVS) program to provide temporary transportation services for TD Veterans within the Northeast Florida region.

Please be advised that the JTA appreciates the opportunity to continue as the Community Transportation Coordinator for Duval County.
