K. <u>NEW BUSINESS</u>

- Marci Larson informed the group the TPO is doing an update to the Alternative Fuels Master Plan and needs fleet information from our partners. If you are not the appropriate person, please forward this information to the correct person within your organization.
- Dave Mckee of JEA informed the group they are preparing a fleet electrification program largely consultative in nature. The objective is to identify and proactively engage fleet owners within JEA's service area, and help them develop a transition plan to transfer from fossil fuels to electric fuels for any vehicles that have attractive use cases. We will have a robust total cost of ownership calculator online and resources available for fleet owners. We will also have experts to conduct a site analysis for fleet owners. This will benefit JEA in terms of finding where large utility upgrades will be needed. This program will start in the second week of June.
- Matamoran Bacon asked if there is any preference in fleet ownership, whether it be a small or large agency or not-for-profit.

Dave Mckee responded JEA designed this program so that every fleet owner can take advantage of it. There will be different tiers of service. The smaller fleets should be able to use the online tools to satisfy their needs.
