CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Norton called the meeting to order at 2 p.m. and Charles Pappas led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Norton asked for approval of the minutes of the March Citizens Advisory Committee meeting.

Pat Keogh moved to approve the March 3, 2021 minutes; Charles Pappas seconded; motion unanimously carried.

Ms. Martinage asked for questions.

- John Stack wanted to know if the resurfacing projects are on a replacement schedule.

Ms. Martinage responded that the resurfacing projects are on an ongoing replacement schedule.

- Jim Green wanted to know the limits of the Mayport Road bike lane/sidewalk project.

Denise Bunnewith responded that it is Atlantic Boulevard to Dutton Avenue.

- Jim Green commented that there is a Complete Streets project in that area.

Denise Bunnewith responded that it is the same project.

- Jim Green wanted to know what bridge is the “railroad bridge” on the I-95 from Forest Street bridge to railroad bridge project.

Ms. Martinage responded that this is the segment going through the Brooklyn area.

- Jim Green wanted to know if there is a capacity project in the area of I-95 and the Forest Street bridge heading north through Brooklyn or LaVilla.

Ms. Martinage responded that she will get back to Mr. Green with an answer.

- Thomas Martin commented that he has safety, capacity and congestion management issues with JTA’s U2C project.

- Tyrone Clark-Murray wanted to know about the resurfacing project on San Juan Avenue to I-95. San Juan Avenue does not intersect with I-95, as it turns into Herschel Street.

Ms. Martinage responded that it should read St. Johns Avenue and will be corrected.

Pat Keogh moved to approve the FDOT's request to amend the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for FY 2020/21 through FY 2024/25; Charles Pappas seconded; motion unanimously carried.

C. DRAFT FY 2021/22 UNIFIED PLANNING WORK PROGRAM (UPWP)

Denise Bunnewith presented the complete draft of the FY 2021/22 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP). Approval will be requested at the May meeting. The following projects were added to Section 5, Special Projects.

- Task 5.11 Clay-Duval County Trail Feasibility Study

Ms. Bunnewith asked for questions.

- Pat Keogh wanted to know when the 8th Street Study will start.

Ms. Bunnewith responded that the new fiscal year begins July 1. We are in the process of selecting new general consultants. We expect the responses early this month, with contracts in place by July 1. The new studies will begin in late July or early August and wrap up by the end of FY 2022.

- Pat Keogh wanted to know if the 8th Street study scope is defined.

Ms. Bunnewith responded that the scope is not defined. The City did a very detailed study for this area and provided guidelines that they would like followed for this study.

- Pat Keogh asked to see the study and guidelines that the City provided.
- Mario Dipola wanted to know if the SNF Report Card could still be done as it is now its own entity.

Mr. Sheffield responded that it can still be done, as the North Florida TPO is still a member of SNF and he is the Board Chairman.

- James Green wanted to know since part of 8th Street is a state road if context sensitive guidelines will be used for this project.

Ms. Bunnewith responded that we will try and use city and state guidelines for this project.

- Lisa McGlynn commented that in the March draft the SR 305 Expansion Study in St. Johns County was on this list. In today's draft, that project is not on the list. Ms. McGlynn wanted to know if this means the project was not selected.

Mr. Sheffield responded that is correct.

D. DRAFT PROJECT SECTIONS FOR THE FY 2021/22 THROUGH FY 2025/26 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP)

Wanda Forrest presented the draft project sections for the FY 2021/22 through FY 2025/26 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). The complete draft will be presented next month, with approval requested in June.

Ms. Forrest asked for questions.

- Jim Robinson wanted to know the distinction between the UPWP and the TIP. Mr. Robinson also wanted to know if the City passes the Local Option Gas Tax (LOGT) with the proposed project list where would these projects fit into the overall scheme of things.

Mr. Sheffield responded that the UPWP is our operating budget that allows us to carry out the MPO functions. The TPO receives approximately \$400,000 annually in local assessments. The planning studies are our way of giving back to the counties that total between \$1.4 – 1.5 million.

The TIP is the FDOT's five-year work program. The LOGT projects will not affect the TIP.

- Chairman Norton wanted to know if staff is taking requests for presentations.

Ms. Forrest responded that yes we are.

Mr. Sheffield responded that staff can provide the TIP presentation schedule to the group, and encouraged everyone to attend one of the scheduled events.

- Lisa McGlynn wanted to know the impact of President Briden's infrastructure plan as it relates to our area.

Mr. Sheffield responded that it is to be determined. For example, there is a lot of emphasis on clean energy efforts which ties into our Clean Fuels initiative. At this time, we have no way of knowing the funding amount that would be dedicated to our region.

- Lisa McGlynn requested that the TIP presentation be made to the St. Johns County Civic Association Roundtable.

E. FDOT AREA PROJECTS UPDATE PRESENTATION

Hampton Ray of FDOT provided a brief update on the major projects within the area.

Mr. Ray asked for questions.

- John Stack wanted to know where the US 17 CSX Overpass is located.

Mr. Ray responded that it is heading west on I-10 to McDuff near the railroad crossing.

- Lisa McGlynn wanted to know where in the planning cycle do we start thinking about alleviating congestion by looking at transit or some other mode of travel.

Mr. Ray responded that our region is growing significantly, and the policy makers are addressing that growth.

L. SMART NORTH FLORIDA UPDATE

Jeff Sheffield gave the following update.

- SNF has hired Clayton Levins as its Executive Director.
- SNF did not receive the National Science Foundation for broadband deployment grant. SNF is awaiting a decision on our grant application to the Florida Broadband Office to install broadband on the east side of Jacksonville.
- Mario Dipola wanted to know if the Smart North Florida report card is comparing us to other areas/regions.

Mr. Sheffield responded that there are community-wide report cards that include matrix that we could use as a benchmark.

M. OLD BUSINESS

1. February 3, 2021 CAC Meeting – Response Needed from Staff/FDOT

- Jim Green wanted to know if the safety project at the interchange of I-295 and Monument Road will be added back into the Work Program?

Ms. Martinage will follow up with Jim Knight and provide a response.

2. March 3, 2021 CAC Meeting – Response Needed from Staff/FDOT

- Thomas Martin wanted to know the difference between a 22' Ford E350 Cutaway Bus and a 24' Ford E350 Cutaway Bus.

Ms. Martinage will follow up with FDOT's Central Office and provide a response.

E-mailed response from Ms. Martinage to Mr. Martin April 14.

- Austin Chapman informed the group that FDOT managed lanes are no longer part of the plan for new capacity on a highway. Mr. Chapman wants the CAC to think about making a recommendation to the TPO Board on a possible alternate solution for managed lanes.

Ms. Martinage responded that the change was initiated when Governor DeSantis took office. All existing proposed but not under construction projects were changed to general use add-lane and reconstruct projects. An official policy paper was released in May 2020 stating that we could consider managed lanes if necessary.

Ms. Martinage will send the paper to Ms. Bunnewith for distribution to the CAC members.

Staff emailed FDOT's Managed Lane Policy to the CAC members April 14.

N. NEW BUSINESS

3. April 7, 2021 CAC Meeting – Response Needed from Staff/FDOT

- Pat Keogh asked to see the study and guidelines that the City provided for the 8th Street Study.

Denise Bunnewith will send the study and guidelines to Mr. Keogh.

- Jim Green wanted to know if there is a capacity project in the area of I-95 and the Forest Street bridge heading north through Brooklyn or LaVilla.

Ms. Martinage will get back to Mr. Green with a response.

- Chairman Norton asked that staff share the TIP presentation schedule with the group.

Wanda Forrest will e-mail the schedule to the CAC members.

TIP Presentation Schedule e-mailed to the CAC members April 19.

- Lisa McGlynn requested that the TIP presentation be made to the St. Johns County Civic Association Roundtable.

Request given to Wanda Forrest, and she will reach out to Ms. McGlynn to set up the presentation.

Staff will present to the St. Johns County Civic Association Roundtable May 10.

- Chairman Norton informed the members that if they have any topics for future workshops to please let him, John Stack or the TPO staff know.
- Pat Keogh wanted to know what the two audit functions are shown on the TPO timeline.

Mr. Sheffield responded that this is our annual financial audit that is spread out across December and January. This is a single function.

- Pat Keogh wanted to know if there is any similar equitable distribution standards among the counties for transportation dollars.

Mr. Sheffield responded that the TPO only has control over the SU and CMAQ funding. There is no external requirement for an equitable distribution of funding. Our region is an urbanized area and we are required to expend the funding within the urbanized area.

None at this time.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 3:09 p.m. The next CAC meeting will be May 5, 2021.

The Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) is the task-based budget of the North Florida Transportation Planning Organization (TPO). The format of the two-year document is loosely outlined in federal guidance and more specifically defined by the Florida Department of Transportation. The UPWP includes administrative tasks including developing the UPWP, a number of required work tasks such as the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), Congestion Management Process (CMP), Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP), and other related planning tasks including transit planning most of which is performed by the Jacksonville Transportation Authority.

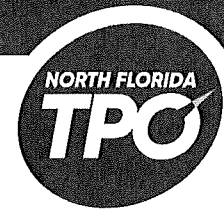
Section 5, Special Projects is being amended with **Resolution 2021-3** to add the following:
