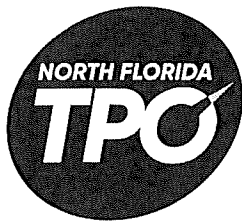

**CALL TO ORDER**

Chairman Rutkowski welcomed everyone and called the Technical Advisory Committee meeting to order at 10:03 a.m. Introductions were made around the room.

**PUBLIC COMMENT**

None at this time.

▶ **A. APPROVE THE JUNE 1, 2022 MEETING MINUTES**

Chairman Rutkowski asked that the June Technical Advisory Committee meeting minutes be approved.

**Reuben Franklin moved to approve the June 1, 2022 meeting minutes; Scott Kornegay seconded; motion unanimously carried.**

▶ **B. JTA REQUESTS AMENDING THE FY 2021/22 THROUGH FY 2025/26 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP)**

Richard Clark presented the following amendment to the Transportation Improvement Program for FY 2021/22 through FY 2025/26.

**Duval County**

- **4242367-2** – JTA Renewable Energy Generation for Electric Vehicles

Mr. Clark asked for questions.

- Dave McKee wanted to know the size of the Armsdale facility.

Mr. Clark responded that the Armsdale facility is JTA's 3.2 acre test site. We will use this facility to test what the load would be to charge the vehicles and if it is feasible.

- Dave McKee wanted to know if Mr. Clark had an idea of the megawatt hours.

Mr. Clark responded that JTA is not far enough along in the process to determine megawatt hours.

**Bill Killingsworth moved to approve the JTA's request to amend the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for FY 2021/22 through FY 2025/26; Dave McKee seconded; motion unanimously carried.**

**► C. FDOT REQUESTS AMENDING THE TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP) FOR FY 2022/23 THROUGH FY 2026/27 TO INCLUDE PROJECTS IN THE ROLL FORWARD REPORT**

Karen Taulbee presented the amendment to the Transportation Improvement Program for FY 2022/23 through FY 2026/27.

The Roll Forward Amendment includes projects or phases of projects that were approved in the FY 2022/23 through FY 2026/27 TIP, but were authorized or begun prior to July 1, 2022. These projects then "Roll Forward" into the first year of the new FY 2022/23 through FY 2026/27 TIP.

Ms. Taulbee asked for questions. There were no questions at this time.

**Bill Killingsworth moved to approve the FDOT's request to amend the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for FY 2021/22 through FY 2025/26 to include projects in the "Roll Forward" report; Sean Rush seconded; motion unanimously carried.**

**D. REVISED TAC BYLAWS**

Jeff Sheffield presented the following proposed revisions to the TAC bylaws for review and discussion.

- ***Membership – If an entity or agency is not represented by the appointed member or alternate for three (3) consecutive meetings, the entity or agency represented by the member will be contacted to designate a new member and alternate. If representation is not available, the seat will be declared vacant.***

- ***Quorum – Committee members or their designated alternates must be present to cast a vote. A quorum shall consist of the majority of those members entitled to vote. (Committee vacant seats will not be counted as eligible votes until filled).***

Mr. Sheffield asked for questions.

- Bill Killingsworth wanted to know if a member sends an alternate would it count as a vacancy.

Mr. Sheffield responded that it would not count as a vacancy.

- Mr. Killingsworth stated that he is still active if he misses three meetings but sends his alternate.

Mr. Sheffield responded that is correct.

- Bill Killingsworth asked if an agency could assign more than one alternate.

Mr. Sheffield responded as long as the entity or agency is represented the number of alternates is not an issue.

**Bill Killingsworth moved to approve the proposed changes to the Bylaws; Reuben Franklin seconded; motion unanimously carried.**

**E. DRAFT PROJECT RECOMMENDATIONS FOR SU FUNDING FOR FY 2023/24 THROUGH FY 2027/28**

Jeff Sheffield presented the draft project recommendations for SU funding for FY 2023/24 through FY 2027/28.

Mr. Sheffield asked for questions. There were no questions at this time.

**F. DRAFT PROJECT RECOMMENDATIONS FOR CMAQ FUNDING FOR FY 2023/24 THROUGH FY 2027/28**

Jeff Sheffield presented the draft project recommendations for CMAQ funding for FY 2023/24 through FY 2027/28.

Mr. Sheffield asked for questions.

- Chris LeDew commented that he supports the SR 228 @ SR 129 project.
- Reuben Franklin commented that the SR 228 @ SR 129 project looks favorable to bicyclists and pedestrians.



Mr. Knight responded sidewalks will be upgraded and peds are being considered for bicyclists.

**G. CITY OF JACKSONVILLE ON-STREET BIKEWAYS AND SHARE-USE PATHS (TRAILS) WEBMAP TOOL PRESENTATION**

Matthew Fall, COJ's Bike-Ped Coordinator, gave a brief presentation on their bike facilities inventory tool.

Mr. Fall asked for questions.

- Chris LeDew asked about the private facilities that were included in the inventory.

Mr. Fall responded that some public agencies have private roads, as well as in some suburban areas gated communities have shared use paths with bike facilities.

- Chris LeDew wanted to know if those gated communities allow the public to access the bike facilities.

Mr. Fall responded that if those facilities within the gated communities were not available to the public we did not include them.

- Chris LeDew wanted to know Mr. Fall's thoughts on including sidewalks as bicycle facilities.

Mr. Fall responded that we only included bike facilities that have striping and signage and are designated a bike facility. At some point, we will do the same thing with sidewalks.

- Karen Taulbee wanted to know if FDOT's information from their bike/ped gap study is included.

Mr. Fall responded that it was included.

- Karen Taulbee commented that FDOT is only able to update the bike/ped data every three to five years. Ms. Taulbee suggested that FDOT and COJ share data to ensure that everyone has the most up to date data.

**H. SMART NORTH FLORIDA UPDATE**

Clayton Levins gave the following update.

- StormSensor will brief the TPO Board in October on the Neptune Beach project.

- TrainFo will present their findings from the pilot program with FDOT for the US 17 and San Juan Avenue area to the TPO Board in November.
- Beginning in September, SNF will hold quarterly stakeholder meetings with a possible virtual option.
