CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Companion welcomed everyone and called the Technical Coordinating Committee meeting to order at 10:01 a.m. Jennifer Lott read each participant's name for the record.

SIGNIFICANT CIRCUMSTANCE DETERMINATION

Vice Chairman Franklin read the following language.

It is reasonably determined by the TCC members physically present at the meeting that those members attending virtual for personal/public safety reasons due to the COVID-19 pandemic constitutes "significant circumstance". Therefore, the Members' reason for absence are approved by the quorum of TCC members physically present. By this action, members attending virtually

may not only participate in debate but <u>must</u> vote, unless they have a voting conflict of interest.

► A. APPROVE THE OCTOBER 7, 2020 MEETING MINUTES

Chairman Companion asked for approval of the September Technical Coordinating Committee meeting minutes.

Bill Killingsworth moved to approve the October 7, 2020 meeting minutes; Ed Lehman seconded; motion unanimously carried.

►B. TCC BYLAWS UPDATE

Marci Larson presented the following revisions to the TCC Bylaws for approval.

- Change the committee name from Technical Coordinating Committee to Technical Advisory Committee. This change will better illustrate the name used by most MPOs.
- The Keystone Heights Airport Authority has been added as an agency that may send a representative.
- The rotation chart for Chair/Vice Chair in Section 8: Electing Officers, Page 4, has been updated through 2028.
- Some time ago the Nassau County School Board asked for representation. Efforts are underway to have representatives from Jacksonville/Duval, Clay and St. Johns Counties. These have been added to the agency list.

- We currently have several agencies/locales that are listed but do not send representatives. Staff outreaches to them periodically to secure representatives.
- The Vice Chair will serve as the floor leader during meetings, moving motions for a vote. (Added to Section 7, #2 October TCC meeting.)
- Minor edits were completed.

Ms. Larson asked for questions. There were no questions at this time.

These bylaws will be forwarded to the TPO Board for their approval.

►C. FDOT REQUESTS AMENDING THE FY 2020/21 THROUGH FY 2024/25 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP)

Autumn Martinage presented the amendment to the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for FY 2020/21 through FY 2024/25 for approval.

 Bill Killingsworth wanted to know what is being done on Southside Boulevard.

Ms. Martinage responded that the Southside Boulevard project will consist of a displaced left-turn. This project has been in the TIP and this action will add funding for right-of-way.

Bill Mann moved to approve the FDOT's request to amend the FY 2020/21 through FY 2024/25 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP); Jerry Box seconded; motion unanimously carried.

D. <u>MOBILITY WEEK PRESENENTATION</u>

Christina Nalsen of FDOT gave a brief Mobility Week presentation.

F. SMART NORTH FLORIDA UPDATE

Jeff Sheffield gave the following update.

We maintain four general planning consultant contracts, and are working
to standardize their activities. For most of our planning studies, the data
collection component is included. The goal is for us to maintain these
data sets within the data exchange. We envision providing the data sets
to our consultants so they would operate from a continuity standpoint. In
turn, the funding used on data collection could then be used to fund
analysis and evaluation efforts.

Terry Shaw with Kimley-Horn gave a brief presentation on data analysis tools that will allow us to standardize the output.

Justin Dennis with Urban SDK gave a brief presentation on a tool to provide data and mapping.

- Bill Mann wanted to know if the database is state-wide.
 - Mr. Sheffield responded that we are gaining the value of work that the consultants and others do in other areas of the country.
 - Mr. Dennis responded that the data sources are state-wide as well as federal. The data sources include such things as real-time weather, traffic crashes, telemetry speed data and general demographic information from the census studies. The purpose is to provide data for the core critical areas in order to avoid gathering the data and allowing access so that the consultants can expand their capabilities.
- Reuben Franklin commented that he likes the idea of a standardized data package, and feels that it would be helpful to have a level of data validation.
 - Mr. Sheffield responded that the new data sources need to be validated, and we are having conversations with DOT Central Office to endorse it so we can then feed the data to a state-wide repository.

 Reuben Franklin commented that if this data could become a dashboard for a particular project that could be analyzed for trends, etc. that would be great.

Mr. Sheffield responded that the goal is to push the limit.
